



Advisor of the Year (District and State)

PURPOSE

To evaluate and recognize outstanding performance and achievements of local SkillsUSA chapter advisors in the areas of leadership, citizenship and professional development.

CLOTHING REQUIREMENT

SkillsUSA blazer, and accompanying official dress is requested. For information about purchasing, refer to the clothing requirements in the general regulations of the *SkillsUSA Championships Technical Standards*.

ELIGIBILITY

Open to active Alabama SkillsUSA advisors. (High School/Secondary advisors must register thru their respective districts to advance to the state level. College/post-secondary advisors must register for the State Leadership Conference to be eligible)

SCHOLARSHIPS

The first place District High School Advisor of the Year will be exempt from State Conference Registration. The first place State High School and College Advisors of the Year will be exempt from National Conference Registration.

EQUIPMENT AND MATERIALS

Advisors need to submit a professional resume detailing SkillsUSA activities and professional development over the past two years.

SCOPE OF THE CONTEST

The contest will consist of an evaluation of the advisor's participation and achievements in areas leadership, citizenship and professional development at the local, district, state and national level. The 1st place Advisor of the Year instructor will advance to the State level. College/post-secondary instructors will be evaluated at the State level only. The State Director will nominate the High School and College Advisor of the Year to represent Alabama at the National Leadership Conference.
