



## Classroom Project Display “Individual” State Only Contest

**PURPOSE:** *Note: This is a Display of the project done in the classroom, NOT the actual project to be displayed. It MUST fit on a standard 6ft. x 3ft. or on the floor within an 8ft. x 8ft. area. No electricity will be provided. There is NO interview required for this contest.*

The purpose of this contest is to allow students and instructors an opportunity to showcase all the great work being done inside the classroom each year. It also enables more students to be a part of the state conference. The event's purpose is to showcase our students' classroom projects and handiwork. Encourage your students to enter the display so we can show the public the craftsmanship that exists in the state's career technical classrooms.

### ELIGIBILITY

The contest is open to both high school and college/postsecondary active SkillsUSA members. Limit (3) entries per school.

### SCOPE OF THE CONTEST

1. All project entries must include a 3 Ring Notebook (SkillsUSA Official 3 ring binder) with the following enclosed information:
  - a. Name of school
  - b. Name of instructor
  - c. Name of student or group leader of the project Learning Objective of the project
  - d. Chronological description of the project as it was developed, complete with problems encountered.
  - e. A summary of the outcomes of the project. *(one page please)*

*Pictures are not required but are preferred.*
2. Projects must fit within a 8'x8' area and require *(no special accommodations will be provided)*
3. Projects may be self-standing or can be placed on a standard 3' x 6' table draped table *(skirted tables will be provided by the contest committee)*
4. No commercial display boards please.
5. Displays may consist of; but, are not limited to the following: models, blueprints, posters, mechanical assemblies, wooden cabinets, automotive parts, electrical models. *(no electrical outlets will be provided)*
6. High School District 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> place winners will advance to the State level. The State Contest will award 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place winners in each division. (High School and College)



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### PROCEDURES FOR SETUP

Each contestant's badge will have a contestant “Number” on the back. Please attach the “Number” [portion only to the Display. A map of the contest area will be provided with the instructor’s registration packet. Student should setup display on the first day of the State Conference, notebooks to be dropped off on the second day of competition. *(Displays must be removed by the announced time. Unclaimed displays will be disposed of by the Conference Center maintenance department)*
